STATEWIDE INTEROPERABILITY EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MINUTES

Wednesday, November 14, 2007

The Statewide Interoperability Executive Committee (SIEC) met on Wednesday, November 14, 2007, at the Claiborne Building Conference Center, Iowa Room 1-153, Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Committee Chair Rizwan Ahmed called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. The roll was called by Lorita Ford, and a quorum was established.

Approval of Minutes – October 24, 2007

On motion of Eric Sivula, seconded by Michael Murphy, the Committee voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the October 24, 2007 meeting.

Special Presentation

Ms. Betty Rinehart with Motorola, presented a 700 Mhz Regulartory Update. She discussed the Bandplan Changes and showed comparisons between the original and the new plan. (Appendix B)

Technology Sub-Committee

Chief Robert Black was not in attendance at today's meeting. Joe Drago stated that the Technology Committee along with the Policies and Procedures Committee have been continuing to work with the SIEC Support Staff to finalize the Louisiana Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan (SCIP). Major Adam Schilling asked the Committee to take another look at the plan, with particular emphasis on the Implementation Section before the final submission on December 3, 2007.

Budget and Finance Sub-Committee

Heyward Jeffers sub-committee report included the following:

- Informed the committee that a request for more than \$24 million has been included in the upcoming budget (08/09) for interoperability and that more could be requested in HB1 once the 08 session started.
- Informed the committee that the Bond Commission had approved over \$9 million in bond money and \$1 million in cash for the construction of a hospital in St. Bernard Parish. The construction should begin late this year or early next. The hardened structure would survive 200 mph winds and could house an emergency operations center for first responders and an evacuation area for those unable to leave or too sick to travel.
- Gen. Downer had been asked by the Gov-elect to be part of the transition committee on emergency operations and Heyward Jeffers will also work with the General on homeland security and emergency operations.

Heyward requested that the technology subcommittee be able to discuss at the next meeting the status of several vendor proposals on "patch proposals" between radios and IP gear that have undergone exhaustive review by the subcommittee and need action by the subcommittee and the committee.

Chairman Rizwan Ahmed asked the Committee members to consider contacting individuals on the Governor's Transition Team to stress the importance of the SIEC.

Policies and Procedures Sub-Committee

Since the Policies and Procedures Committee has been helping with the Louisiana Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan (SCIP), Susan informed the Committee that she had no further discussions or changes to be brought to the Committee.

Planning Sub-Committee

There was no report from the Planning Sub-Committee.

Old Business

On motion from Eric Deroche, seconded by Robert Jump, the Committee voted to increase funding in the amount of \$20,687 for its existing partnership with the Calcasieu Parish Sheriff's Office. The motion was carried with one objection from Mike Murphy who believed that the funding would set a precedence of matching funds for local grants

New Business

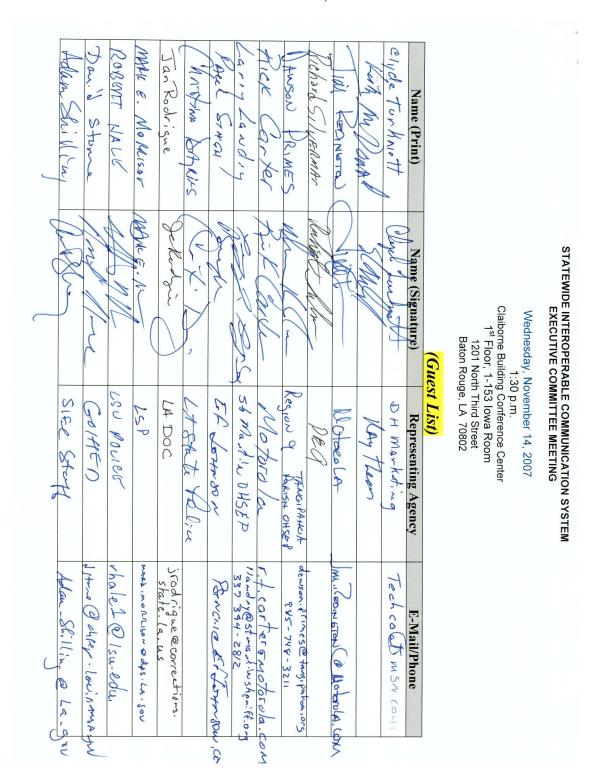
On recommendation from Jeya Selvaratnam, the Committee agreed to post on the SIEC website the names and corresponding points of contact of agencies using the statewide system.

Ms. Lorita Ford, Administrative Support Staff for the Committee commented that an SIEC meeting schedule for the first half of 2008 has been drafted. She informed them of the dates and that if anyone would like to host a "regional" meeting, they should contact her with dates and locations. Also, the Committee agreed that during the first quarter they would re-visit the issue of whether it is necessary to continue to meet twice a month.

Adjournment

On a motion by Sgt. Michael Murphy, seconded by Ken Hughes, and there being no further business to discuss, the Statewide Interoperable Executive Committee was adjourned by the Chair at 2:55 p.m.

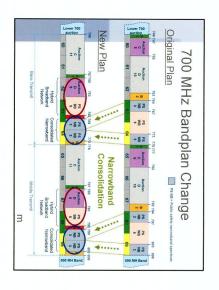

Narrowband Consolidation

The narrowband allocation has been moved to 769-775/799-805 MHz)

Limis potential for interference from broadband
Reduces the number of internal guardbands
Still the same amount of narrowband spectrum
Narrowband channels can still be aggregated to 25 kHz bandwidth
Incumbent 700 MHz systems must move to the consolidated narrowband spectrum by February 17, 2009
Deployment under the old band plan prohibited after August 30, 2007
Unless you request a waiver

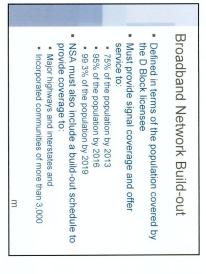
