1	AN ACT
2	To enact Subpart L of Part II-A of Chapter 1 of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the Louisiana
3	Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 39:100.41, relative to state funds;
4	to establish the Louisiana Interoperability Communications Fund as a special fund
5	in the state treasury; to provide for the dedication, deposit, use, and investment of
6	monies in the fund; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related
7	matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. Subpart L of Part II-A of Chapter 1 of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the
10	Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 39:100.41, is hereby enacted to read
11	as follows:
12	SUBPART L. LOUISIANA INTEROPERABILITY COMMUNICATIONS FUND
13	§100.41. Louisiana Interoperability Communications Fund
14	A. There is hereby established in the state treasury, as a special fund, the
15	Louisiana Interoperability Communications Fund, hereinafter referred to as the
16	<u>"fund".</u>
17	B. Subject to a legislative appropriation, the treasurer is authorized and
18	directed on the effective date of this Act to deposit any monies available into the
19	fund from the general fund. Monies in the fund shall also include any monies
20	appropriated annually to the fund by the legislature, including federal funds;
21	donations, gifts, or grants; and any other monies which may be provided by law to
22	be deposited in the fund. The monies in this fund shall be appropriated,
23	administered, and used solely as provided in Subsection C of this Section and only
24	in the amounts appropriated annually by the legislature. All unexpended and
25	unencumbered monies in this fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the

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1fund. The monies in this fund shall be invested by the state treasurer in the same2manner as monies in the state general fund, and interest earned on the investment of3these monies shall be credited to this fund.

4 C. Monies in the fund shall be appropriated and used solely to establish, design, develop, acquire, construct, administer, operate, and maintain an 5 6 interoperability communications system within the state to serve state and local 7 emergency and first responders and to meet National Incident Management Systems 8 (NIMS) communication requirements, which shall include but not be limited to 9 administration and staff support, training, acquisition and implementation of 10 hardware and software systems, voice system upgrades, Internet protocol systems, 11 equipment upgrades, wireless, broadband and relay systems, and the maintenance of 12 all feasible interoperability systems, and an all-hazards emergency alert system 13 which shall be able to support a text-based emergency alert and notification system 14 containing messaging, e-mail, Internet access, cellular capability, desktop alert 15 applications, prerecorded voice messages and text pager messages, and satellite 16 phone and satellite radio with two-way send and reply capabilities, and include a web 17 site which provides emergency information to the citizens of the state including but 18 not limited to such things as information relative to the Department of Homeland 19 Security and Emergency Preparedness, Federal Emergency Management Agency, 20 charities and faith-based groups that provide relief during times of emergency, and 21 state and local shelters operating during a declared state of emergency; evacuation 22 plans and routes; home safety including emergency kits, the supplying of food and 23 water, pet care, and sheltering in place; and communications information, as well as 24 a rapid communications system which shall have at a minimum a text-based 25 emergency alert and notification component where users may self-register to receive 26 all-hazards emergency information from their local parishes and the state and users 27 can manage their personal contact information whether by e-mail, cell phone, pager, 28 or personal digital assistant as they choose. The text-based alert and notification 29 system shall be capable of enabling local and state emergency officials to send text 30 alerts to such users based upon their preferences or geographical location by parish,

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1	emergency preparedness and homeland security regions, or statewide, and the system
2	shall be capable of tracking replies from such users.
3	D. The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency
4	Preparedness, the office of the chief information officer, the Department of Public
5	Safety and Corrections, and the members of the Statewide Interoperable
6	Communication System Executive Committee shall assist, as requested by the
7	governor, in the implementation and establishment of an interoperability
8	communications system within the state, including but not limited to applying for
9	grants or financial assistance from the federal government, individuals, or
10	corporations.
11	E. Appropriations from the fund to an entity which exceed ten percent
12	individually or in the aggregate of the total appropriations made from the fund in that
13	fiscal year shall not be implemented until the entity receiving the appropriation has
14	submitted an expenditure plan for approval to the Joint Legislative Committee on the
15	Budget. All expenditures shall comply with the Louisiana Procurement Code, R.S.
16	<u>39:1551, et seq.</u>
17	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
18	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
19	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
20	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
21	effective on the day following such approval.
