Guide For State And Local All-Hazards Emergency Operations Planning, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)

National Response Framework

Presents the guiding principles that enable all response partners to prepare for and provide a unified National response to disasters and emergencies - from the smallest incident to the largest catastrophe. The Framework establishes a comprehensive, National, all-hazards approach to domestic incident response.

A comprehensive, nationwide, systematic approach to incident management.





State Laws + Plans + Guidelines

Louisiana Revised Statutes (RS)

RS 17:416.6 (2013) requires each school principal to prepare a school crisis response management and response plan in accordance with school board policy. The plan shall be devised with input from students enrolled in the school and their parents, teachers at the school, other school employees, community leaders, local law enforcement and fire, public safety and emergency preparedness officials. Each school is to submit a plan in writing to the school board for approval. The plan must be reviewed annually and revised as necessary.

RS 17:3996 (2013) requires Louisiana Charter schools to prepare a school crisis response plan in accordance with RS 17:416.6.

RS 29:726.3. (C.)(1) requires the superintendent of each local school district, and the recovery school district, to provide building floor plans, evacuation plans and other fire protection information relative to each building and any known hazards associated with the building to the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP). (2) requires each nonpublic and/or proprietary school to provide building floor plans, evacuation plans, evacuation plans, and other fire protection information relative to each building and any known hazards associated with the building located in Louisiana to their local Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (OHSEP) for submission to GOHSEP.

Louisiana Emergency Operations Plan

Provides guidance for the full range of natural, technological, terrorist and attack-related emergencies and disasters. The Louisiana Emergency Operations Plan conforms to Federal law and regulations such as FEMA's Comprehensive Preparedness Guide (CPG) 101 version 2 and the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act as amended.
